CLIMATE SMART COMMUNITY SERVICE RECOMMENDATION

Develop a roadmap for prioritizing and implementing the City's climate protection efforts, specifically those that are in progress but need further support, and those identified but not yet started. This roadmap will also serve as a tool for educating the City's incoming administration.

CLIMATE PROTECTION ISSUE TO BE ADDRESSED

The City of Albany has been a leader in climate action planning efforts in the state, especially since establishing the Mayor's Office of Energy & Sustainability and incorporating climate protection into its Albany 2030 comprehensive plan. With so many actions and programs identified or in progress, the City would like to develop a roadmap for prioritizing and implementing these efforts, specifically those that are in progress but may need further support or to be strengthened, and those identified but not yet started. VHB will work with City planners to determine criteria or guiding principles for prioritization of climate actions, in order to assess progress, revitalize efforts, and also serve as a roadmap for guiding the City's new incoming administration on climate action.
