The Climate Smart Communities (CSC) program is a New York State initiative to help local communities reduce greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions, prepare for effects of climate change and save taxpayers money. The program is designed to address 10 focus areas, or "pledge elements," outlined in the CSC Pledge: http://www.dec.ny.gov/energy/53013.html.

New York State is offering technical support to communities that have adopted the CSC Pledge. This profile provides a stepping stone for identifying a technical support service package to help the Village of Niskayuna progress through the 10 pledge elements (see below).

GIPA is a leader in New York State's efforts to develop more renewable and cleaner sources of power, such as hydropower, which is a renewable energy source that is also reliable and low cost.
